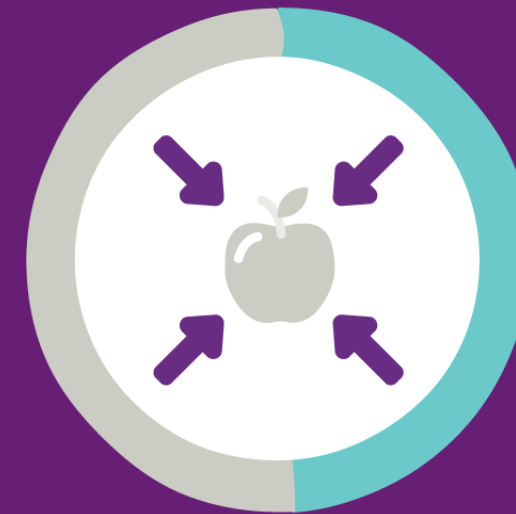

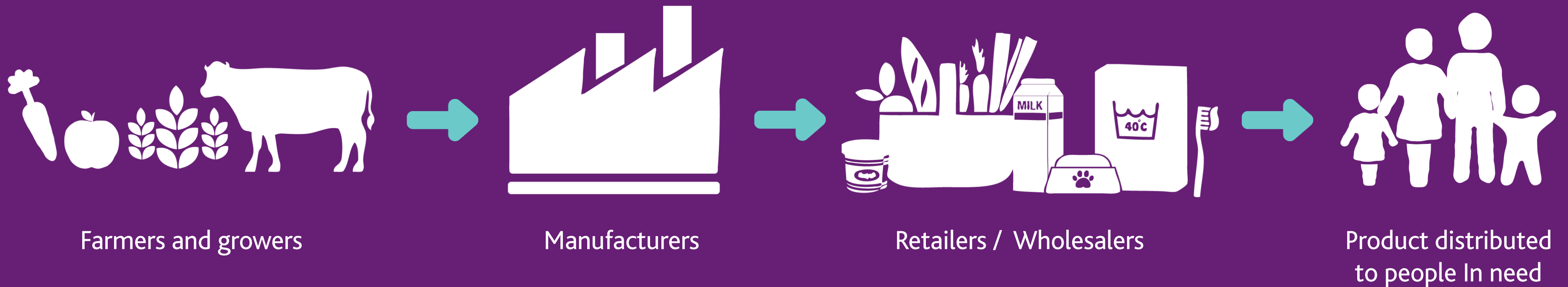

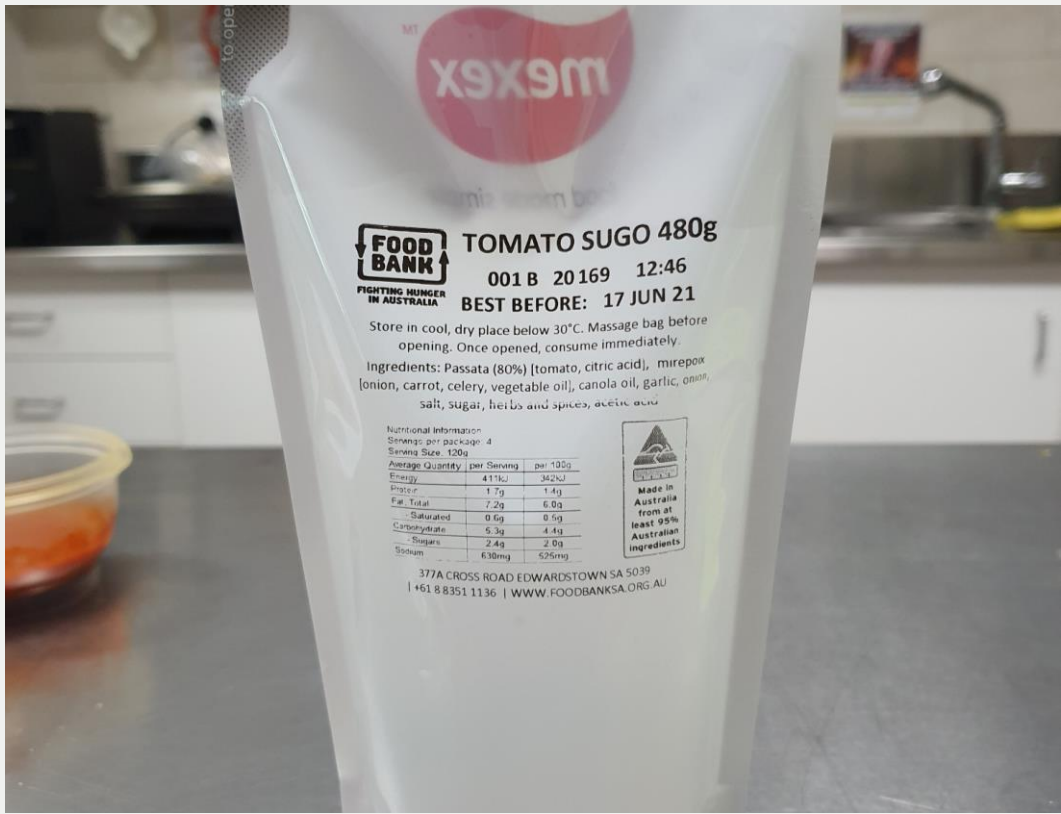
COVID-19 IMPACT

TOP 10 HUNGER HOT SPOTS IN SA

Regions that have the biggest gaps in meeting demand

Fleurieu – 11,349 extra meals needed each month (1.1% demand met)

Murray Bridge – 9583 (1.7%)

Campbelltown – 15410 (2%)

Barossa – 6594 (7 %)

Loxton, Renmark, Barmera – 7104 (10-27%)

Onkaparinga – 38,926 (Seaford worst off)

Playford - 32,921 (Craigmore and Smithfield)

Port Adelaide Enfield – 28358 (Port Adelaide)

Salisbury – 25450

Charles Sturt – 18846

FOODBANK VALUE

Potential Cost to SA Government without Foodbank

Service or outcome currently provided by Foodbank	Financial Impact that would be borne by the SA Government or Community (known or implied)
SA share of food donated by major food companies around Australia to the national Foodbank network	\$5million pa
Fresh fruit & vegetables donated from SA Farmers, Wholesalers and Distributors	\$10million pa
Free or discounted transport to major regional centres	\$1 million pa
Foodbank’s volunteer workforce (equivalent paid staff)	\$2.3 million pa
Food rescue operations to reduce need for landfill	1.5 million kgs pa
In kind donations of services (eg IT, audit, facilities)	\$2 million

ESTIMATED VALUE > \$22 MILLION PA

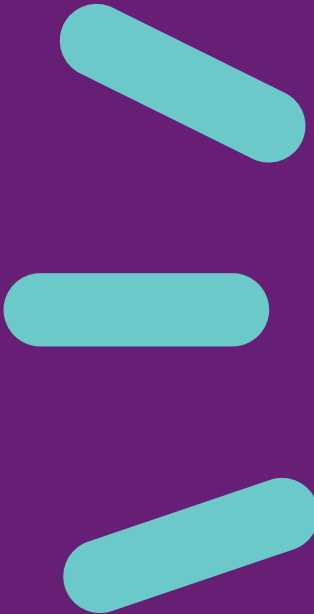

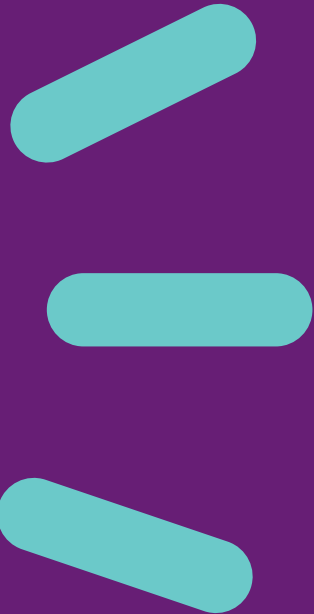
