Kim Potger is a retired Gawler Pharmacist and Past President of the Rotary Club of Gawler.

Kim has visited India as a member of Rotary's Polio Immunisation Team several times and helped immunise thousands of children.

Kim presented information on how Rotary has been working to eradicate polio for more than 35 years, with their goal of ridding the world of this disease is closer than ever.

As a founding partner of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, they've reduced polio cases by 99.9 percent since their first project to vaccinate children in the Philippines in 1979.

With Rotary members contributing more than \$2.1 billion and countless volunteer hours to protect nearly 3 billion children in 122 countries from this paralysing disease.

Rotary's advocacy efforts have played a role in decisions by governments to contribute more than \$10 billion to the effort.

Kim indicated that polio remains endemic only in Afghanistan and Pakistan. But it's crucial to continue working to keep other countries polio-free, particularly as new cases have just emerged in Papua New Guinea.

Noting that if all eradication efforts stopped today, within 10 years, polio could paralyse as many as 200,000 children each year.

Kim answered questions from members.
